The 2013-2014 Richard and Barbara Debs Composer's Chair



David Lang has been appointed to hold the Richard and Barbara Debs Composer's Chair at Carnegie Hall for the 2013–2014 season. In addition to several performances of his work at Carnegie Hall, key elements of the composer's season-long residency include *collected stories*, a six-concert series in April 2014 that explores the world of musical storytelling, and *Creating New Music*, a collaborative workshop presented by Carnegie Hall's Weill Music Institute in November 2013 that offers training and commissioning opportunities for young composers and chamber ensembles, capped by a concert in Zankel Hall titled *New Voices, New Music*.

Central to Mr. Lang's residency is *collected stories*, in which six distinct themes are explored in six Zankel Hall performances, all curated by Mr. Lang. These multi-genre concerts—*hero*, *spirit*, *love/loss*, *travel*, *(post)folk*, and *memoir*—showcase different modes of storytelling in music, from medieval Beowulf to conceptual Cage, and include world premieres by Mr. Lang, Kate Moore, and Kaki King, all commissioned by Carnegie Hall. Commemorating the 10th anniversary of the opening of Judy and Arthur Zankel Hall, the series also features works by Richard Ayres, Donnacha Dennehy, Nico Muhly, Arvo Pärt, and Julia Wolfe, among others, pulling together disparate threads from past and present to highlight the ways music and narrative work together. *collected stories* concludes with the world premiere of Mr. Lang's *mystery sonatas*.

Mr. Lang's the so-called laws of nature will be heard earlier in the season during a November 2013 concert by So Percussion that includes a collaborative work, *Triple Music*, performed with electronic duo Matmos and guitarist Bryce Dessner. In February 2014, George Manahan leads the American Composers Orchestra and The Crossing chamber choir in the New York premiere of Mr. Lang's 2010 work, *statement to the court*. In March 2014, Ensemble ACJW performs the composer's dark and rhythmically complex *pierced*.

Passionate and prolific, David Lang embodies the restless spirit of invention with his creation of new forms that defy categorization. The musically omnivorous creator references folk, pop, and jazz influences in his compositions, while at the same time being deeply rooted in the classical tradition. *Musical America*'s 2013 Composer of the Year, Mr. Lang is one of the country's most performed composers. Audiences around the globe have heard his work in performances by the Santa Fe Opera, New York Philharmonic, Berlin Radio Choir, Boston Symphony Orchestra, Munich Chamber Orchestra, and Kronos Quartet; and at Tanglewood, the BBC Proms, Munich Biennale, and elsewhere. Mr. Lang is also the recipient of numerous honors and awards, including the Pulitzer Prize, Rome Prize, BMW Music-Theater Prize (Munich), and grants from the Guggenheim Foundation, Foundation for Contemporary Performance Arts, National Endowment for the Arts, New York Foundation for the Arts, and American Academy of Arts and Letters. Mr. Lang is co-founder and co-artistic director of New York's legendary music collective Bang on a Can and is also a professor of composition at the Yale School of Music.

Previous holders of the Richard and Barbara Debs Composer's Chair at Carnegie Hall are Osvaldo Golijov (2012–2013), Kaija Saariaho (2011–2012), Brad Mehldau (2010–2011), Louis Andriessen (2009–2010), Elliott Carter (2008–2009), Thomas Adès (2007–2008), John Adams (2003–2007), Pierre Boulez (1999–2003), and Ellen Taaffe Zwilich (1995–1999).
