Dear Young Lions of Jazz!

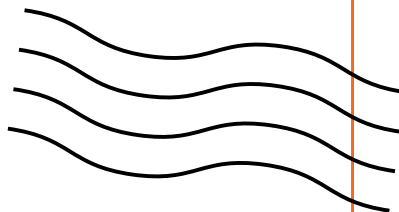

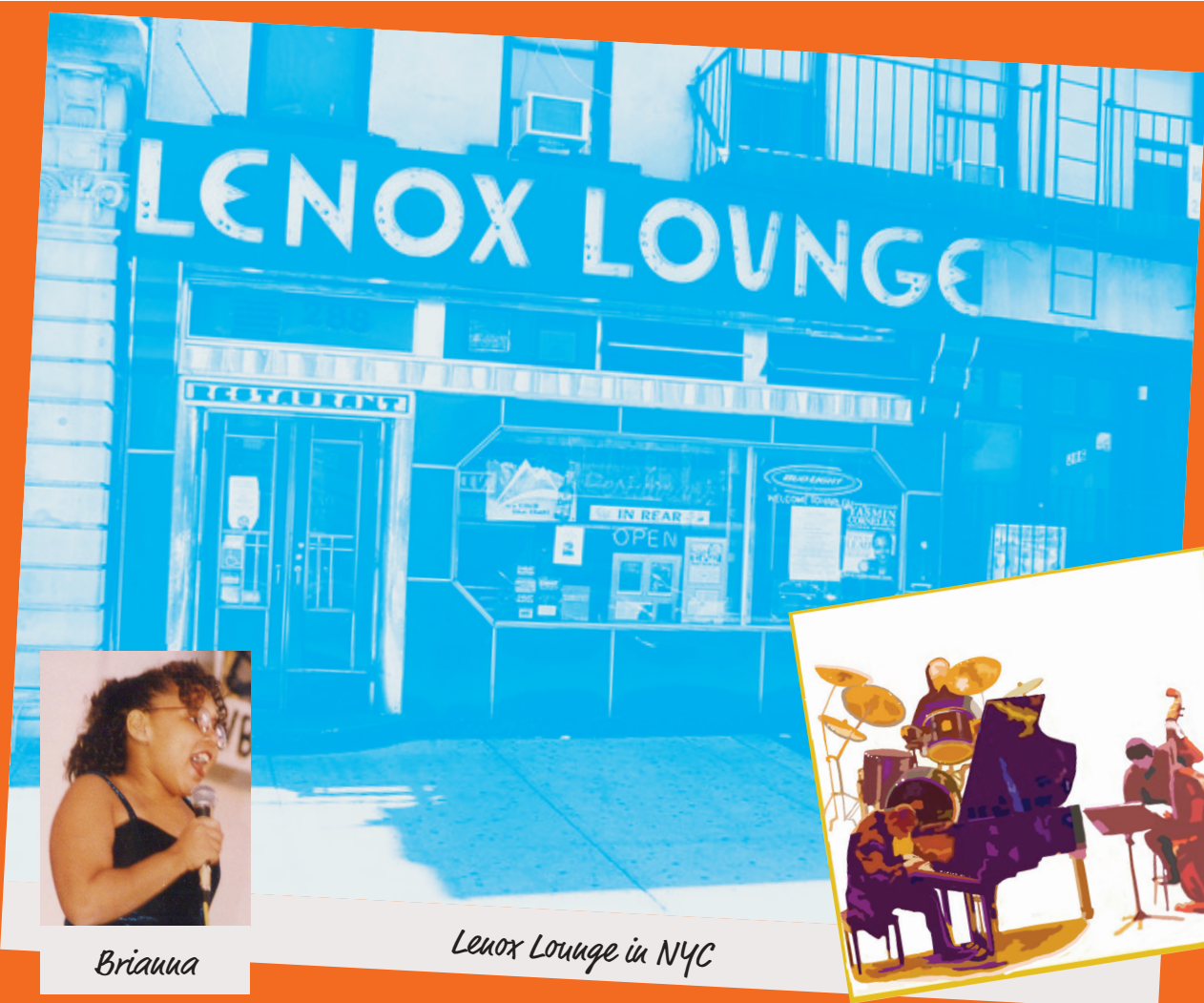
